Pastor's Homework: A Brief Outline of *Isaiah*

"The British are coming! The British are coming!" Although Paul Revere never shouted this legendary phrase on his famous late night ride during the Revolutionary War, one can find a similar sense of urgency to the prophet Isaiah as he rebukes Israel for their many sins and warns of the swarm of enemies that will soon overtake them. At the time, Israel and Judah were at peak size and strength. The word of the Lord is revealed to Isaiah and is what much of the book is, proclamation from the Lord through the mouth of Isaiah. As a singular book, the prophecies and promises of Isaiah are some of the most frequently quoted throughout Scripture.

The Lord is angry and frustrated with the people because they disregard His word and live contrary to His ways. Previously they had been faithful, but now they have stumbled and fallen, and are actively working against the Lord. But even with the Lord's disgust, he promises to wash away the filth of the people and cleanse them of their stains, providing refuge and shelter from the wrath. But the wrath that is to come for Israel is not just storms or inclement weather, the Lord "will raise a signal for nations far away, and whistle for them from the ends of the earth" (5:25) and they will come with vengeance. Chapter six goes backward chronologically and we hear Isaiah's call story and several similarities to the call stories of Jeremiah and Ezekiel that occur later. In Isaiah's call one can see the work of the law being prepared as people will not be able to understand and their hearts will be dulled by this. Even though the people will seem spiritually and even physically dead, God will send "the holy seed" (6:13) even though the line appears

dead, and only 10% of the people will remain. "Behold the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." (7:14) Here is truly good news of the One who would come following the years of destruction that will soon begin.

First, Israel will be tormented by the Assyrian Empire, as the nation will rise up and plunder the territory and people. This will be a time of great darkness both describing the bleak conditions but also the emotional and spiritual state of things. "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light" (9:2) and this light is the salvation that comes from the Lord for his throne will know no end. Despite the coming captivity and terror, again "a remnant will return, the remnant of Jacob, to the mighty God" (10:21) for "there shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse" (11:1). But the people will not just see the Assyrian Empire, another empire would arise following them, the Babylonians. Destruction during this time will be brutal and there will be great wrath, says the Lord. Judgment will happen across the entire earth and people will be scattered.

But despite the distress and the ruins, this is not the end. "He will swallow up death forever; and the Lord God will wipe away tears from all faces" (25:8). As Christians we point to Christ, for He destroyed death forever through his death and resurrection, bringing new life for "Your dead shall live; their bodies shall rise. You who dwell in dust, awake and sing for joy!" (26:19) This is surely a wonderful promise, but Isaiah again reminds the people that in the near-term, there will be much pain and suffering before this. Even though your eyes see great chaos, "Behold, I am the one who has laid as a found in Zion, a stone, a tested stone, a precious cornerstone, of a sure foundation: 'Whoever believes will not be in haste." (Continued on Next Page) (28:16)

Isaiah is clear of the coming empires that will soon invade (Babylonians & Persians) and carry off the people and treasures of Israel. Again he does not leave the people in their despair but provides comfort for the One who is to come, "Prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God." (40:3) Your Savior is coming for he will blot out your transgressions, "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine." (43:1) This promise of salvation is not only for Israel but also for "the foreigners who join themselves to the Lord, to minister to him, to love the name of the Lord, and to be his servants" (56:6). Salvation is not a restoration of this old world full of sin and death, but instead the Lord will "create new heavens and a new earth, and the former things shall not be remembered or come into mind." (65:17)
